
Work Force Trends

Population

Bingham County's population increased steadily, albeit slowly, rising 7 percent since 2000 to 45,607 in the 2010 Census. 2011 estimates show the population to be up to 45,952. Blackfoot is the county seat and largest city. The county is a major farm service, potato processing and shipping center.

Flat and fertile farmland surrounded by mountains and crossed by the Snake River that provides water for fishing, boating and irrigation offer a picturesque setting and a lifestyle few people want to leave.


Most of the population increase during the decade was natural – births exceeding deaths. But recently in-migration of workers from other countries and other states contributed significantly.



Labor Force & Employment

Bingham County's economy is heavily dependent on agriculture but has a diverse employer base that demands a diverse work force. High technology metal fabricator Premier Technology and First American Title both have their headquarters in Bingham County. Idaho State Hospital South and the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes' gambling operation are other large nonfarm employers. The county's location between two major trade centers – Pocatello to the south and Idaho Falls to the north – provides additional work force and employment opportunities.

Bingham County's civilian labor force grew steadily through the decade while its unemployment rate gradually declined until the recession began grabbing hold. The unemployment rate jumped significantly in 2008 and



continued climbing after that while the labor force fell in 2009 before rebounding the following year.


The proximity to the Idaho National Laboratory, Pocatello, Idaho Falls, and the Fort Hall Indian Reservation provides a wide variety of job opportunities.

Efforts to attract new business to the county by Bingham Economic Development Corporation hold promise for the county's economic future.

Covered Employment & Wages

Bingham County's large agricultural base goes hand in hand with trade and manufacturing to provide nearly half of all jobs in the county.

Government accounts for nearly another 29 percent because of Idaho's State Hospital South, the University of Idaho Agricultural Experimental Station and several local school districts.

Wages in the county are lower than in most of the United States and fall in about the middle of all Idaho counties.
