
Work Force Trends

Population

Franklin County has experienced rapid population growth in the past 10 years, becoming part of the Logan, Utah, metropolitan statistical area after the 2000 census as a result of its commuting patterns. The population grew 12.8 percent over the decade to 12,786 according to the 2010 Census. 2011 estimates place the population at 12,850. Located on the Idaho-Utah border, the county became a magnet for Utah residents seeking available land, affordable housing and a rural lifestyle.

Franklin County is home to Franklin, Idaho's first city. The county seat, Preston, is also the largest city and the trade center in the county. It was the setting for the 2004 cult movie "Napoleon Dynamite."

The county offers excellent outdoor activities among its many mountains and lakes.




Labor Force & Employment

With a diverse, skilled labor force, Franklin County has consistently had one of the lowest unemployment rates in southeastern Idaho. Although the unemployment rate rose to 5.1 percent in 2009 due to the recession, that was the lowest rate in all of eastern Idaho and second lowest among the 44 counties. Many residents commute to Logan, Utah, and some continue to work in the oil fields of neighboring Wyoming and Utah.

The recession slowed residential and commercial construction from the fevered pace of 2007. Manufacturing jobs declined as national demand for products diminished.

Franklin County's civilian labor force grew 14.2 percent between 2001 and 2011. Ample employment, a unique lifestyle and outstanding




recreational opportunities kept the population at home and enticed workers from other areas. Between 2001 and 2011 employment grew 11.9 percent as jobs kept pace with the growing labor force.

The county's economy depends heavily on agriculture but also benefits from manufacturing, retail trade and services. Over the decade, most job growth occurred in services, trade and construction.

Industry Employment & Wages

Agricultural trade and manufacturing provides about a third of all jobs in Franklin County. Agriculture accounts for another 6 percent so over a third of the jobs are agriculture-related.

Government provides 34 percent of the jobs, primarily in public education and at the medical center.

Wages in Franklin County are lower than most of the state because a large number of jobs are in trade and services, where pay is typically low.

Per capita personal income rose 45 percent from 2000 to 2008 before the recession claimed 5 percent of the gain, and per capita income slipped back to \$25,837 in 2009.
